Euclid Corridor Public Art projects will be unveiled at community forum

CLEVELAND – The Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority (RTA) will unveil future public art projects for the Euclid Corridor Transportation Project at the Cleveland Public Library – Stokes Auditorium on April 4, 2005 at 11:30 AM.

More than \$1 million in public art projects will be presented by Cleveland Public Art, who managed the selection process and design development for the RTA.

Five artists/art teams were selected to create integrated projects within the urban and streetscape designs to include seating elements, tree grates, paving and hardscape designs, graphic identity and wayfinding signage, interactive kiosks, and fixture elements.

Three more artists were recently selected by the RTA's Arts In Transit Committee to design and install independent artwork in the University Circle, Playhouse Square and East Cleveland areas.

All artists conceptual developments will be featured at the forum. Future Call to Artists proposals for the ECTP will also be discussed.
