RTA community meeting tonight for Euclid Corridor Project

CLEVELAND -- Officials of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority (RTA) have scheduled four public meetings to update the community on the progress of the \$220-million Euclid Corridor Transportation Project.

The first meeting is from 5:30-7:30 p.m. tonight, Wednesday, Jan. 15, in the Stokes Wing of the Cleveland Public Library, 525 Superior Ave. NE.

The Project will affect Euclid Avenue and some parallel streets from Public Square to the Louis Stokes Station at Windermere in East Cleveland. Construction is set to begin in 2004, with completion targeted for 2006.
