### **RTA hosts meetings to update community on Euclid Corridor progress**

CLEVELAND -- Officials of the Greater Cleveland Regional Transit Authority (RTA) have scheduled four public meetings to update the community on the progress of the \$220-million Euclid Corridor Transportation Project.

The Project will affect Euclid Avenue and some parallel streets from Public Square to the Louis Stokes Station at Windermere in East Cleveland. Construction is set to begin in 2004, with completion targeted for 2006.

"The Euclid Corridor Project will change the way people view public transit in Cleveland," says RTA CEO & General Manager Joe Calabrese. "We are excited about this Project, and once our riders learn more about what is planned, they will be excited too."

- **Midtown:** Wednesday, Jan. 22, Liberty Hill Baptist Church, 8206 Euclid Ave.
- **University Circle:** Thursday, Jan. 23, Thwing Center, Case Western Reserve University, 11111 Euclid Ave.
- **East Cleveland:** Wednesday, Jan. 29, Martin Luther King Jr. Civic Center, 14801 Shaw Ave.
